

The Gospel

Alleluia, alleluia.

This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased. Alleluia

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke 3. 15-17, 21-22 Glory be to thee O Lord

⁴ John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶ Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ He proclaimed,

"The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸ I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." ⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹ And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

Reflection

Why, did Jesus come for baptism? John the Baptist's, message was a call to "...a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" and the scripture teaches us in several places that Jesus was without sin

For Jesus this is a **moment of transition**. Prior to this event are the hidden years working in Nazareth, living with his family. From this moment he never returns to the carpenter's bench and we are told in all three gospels that he is driven out into the wilderness to prepare for his ministry.

It was a **moment of approval**. Luke records the words "You are my beloved son in whom I am well pleased" The voice of the Father is heard. The church has regarded this event as the first manifestation of the Trinity which is why it is placed within the season of Epiphany as another 'manifestation'.

It was a moment of equipping. The Holy Spirit descended on Jesus symbolised by a dove, an image not chosen by accident. Doves in scripture are symbols of peace, innocence and sacrifice. Jesus was conceived by the Holy Spirit, "the Holy Spirit will come upon you" the angel says to Mary; the Holy Spirit was already present in his life. But in this moment the Holy Spirit comes upon him for the purpose of his ministry.

It was a moment of identification. Jesus visibly identified himself with us in his baptism. Although he was like us in all things yet without sin, in his humanity he understands our struggles and joys. He is able to sympathise with us. How might we understand this?

The Baptism of Christ – a parable

The queue along the riverbank now stretched back into the tree line as people slowly made their way towards the water. There was not much talking as they shuffled along; each person had their own story, their own regret and sorrow for the past, and a desire for change. John's words rang in their ears; "Come and get ready – wash the past away – something is coming soon, something wonderful!"

As they joined the queue, they had to pass a little hut where they were given a number of labels – a bit like post-stick notes – which they had to stick on themselves. 'Cheat', liar, selfish, bad temper, murderer, thief, adulterer, gossip etc. etc. No one got past without a handful and it just made things worse to see how many you were given.

But the man in the hut was puzzled by the next person who joined the queue. Although he hunted for this man's labels but could find none, he shrugged his shoulders, surely there must be something?

Bewildered, he watched as the man began to pull the labels off the person in front of him and stick them on himself. He moved down the queue to the next person and the next and the next taking all their labels each time.

By the time he reached the river he was quite covered from head to foot. He waded into the water...

John stared hard and beneath the labels recognised his cousin Jesus. "Why do you come to me?" he asks but already he is beginning to understand. As he pours the water over Jesus, and as he falls back into the river, the labels drop away. He rises to stand, a voice from heaven is heard;" You are my Son, the beloved, with you I am well pleased."

At Christmas we celebrate a child-Jesus; God coming among us. At his baptism Jesus begins his public work and in the act of baptism, prefigures the purpose for his coming.

Is the river muck still stuck with my sins?
Have sunken stones fossilised my offence?
Did my Lord descend with such a shameful load and lodge it in the Jordan river bed?.
Is this His solemn hour drawing close?
He rises from the stream with sudden breath.

This only picks up one aspect of Jesus baptism, but perhaps it helps us understand other scriptures which tells us that Jesus was 'made sin', identified with sin in his death on the cross. As if in that moment all that is broken, twisted, evil and destructive is focussed into one point and dealt with.

Which helps us understand our own forgiveness. It is not so much our individual offences and failings, small or great that are forgiven but the whole principle of sin. Sin which separates us from a holy God is dealt with by God and a Way opened for us to become forgiven children of God.

The Nicene Creed

Lord Jesus Christ, in you the Father makes us and all things new. Transform the poverty of our nature by the riches of your grace, and in the renewal of our lives make known your heavenly glory. Amen.
